Learning outcomes: Students will acquire a systematic overview of the thoughts from respective groups of NT writings (gospels, epistles) that were produced through exegetical work. This course will systematically present the teaching of Jesus. Theology of the New Testament is written by different authors with different focus and emphasis, though using the same text material. This shows that this material can be viewed upon from different angles and doing theology is a creative process. It is therefore necessary to provide also the history and the current state of play of this particular branch of theological research. Students will acquire the ability to independently reflect upon different questions from theological perspective and use the accumulated knowledge to formulate positions to current issues.	
Class syllabus: 1. History of the discipline. Ancient church. Reformation. Enlightenment. “Pure historic research”. Newer and recent history of the discipline.	

2. The kingdom of God as the central topic of Jesus' teaching. Variants of the term "Kingdom of God". Thoughts about "Kingdom of God" in the Old Testament and in Judaism.
3. History of the research about "Kingdom of God". Albrecht Ritschl, Johannes Weiss, Rudolf Bultmann and his school. Charles Harold Dodd, Werner Georg Kümmel.
4. "Kingdom of God" as the expected entity on the future (near and far).
5. "Kingdom of God" as a present entity.
6. Content of the "Kingdom of God". Beatitudes, Lord's Prayer.
7. Call to repentance as consequence of the proclamation of "The Kingdom of God".
8. Call to repentance addressed to those who rely on their righteousness.
9. Attitude of Jesus to the law and halacha.
10. Jesus and his forgiving attitude to notorious sinners.
11. Jesus and his statements about state, marriage....
12. Titles of Jesus in the gospels.
