Russell's epistemology and ontology; logic and language; logicism. Ludwig Wittgenstein – Tractatus logicophilosophicus; picture theory of language. Logical positivism of the Vienna Circle and the radical refusal of metaphysics; the empiricist criterion of meaning; protocol sentences; Karl Popper's response to logical positivism.
