Students will be able to explain the development of the museum phenomenon in Europe and define the term museum. Students will be able to classify museums based on typology. Students will become familiar with different types of European museums and heritage sites, being able to list examples. During the second half of the semester, students analyze these interviews. The results of the analyses will be discussed in the final colloquium.

Violation of academic ethics will be punished, and the student will lose all the received points in the relevant assessment.
