Course requirements: Continuous assessment: a) active participation in class, engaging in discussions (30 points), a paper of 8000 characters (draft topics will be published on the MS Teams platform at the beginning of the semester), which implies the study of secondary sources and synthesis of the acquired knowledge, or b) presentation of a foreign-language publication on the political systems of post-Soviet countries (the choice of the publication is approved by the instructor). Required components of the presentation are: the topic and the author's research questions, the key ideas of the text and the logical relationships between them (may be elaborated in the form of a mind map), the method of argumentation, the author's conclusions (70 points). The student must achieve at least 60% success in all parts of the assessment. Violation of academic ethics will be punished, and the student will lose all the received points in the relevant part of the assessment. Grading scale: A: 100-91, B: 90-83, C: 82-73, D: 72-67, E: 66-60, FX: 59- and below. A maximum of 2 absences with documented evidence are allowed during the semester. Scale of assessment (preliminary/final): 100/0	
Learning outcomes: Students are provided with a basic overview of the development of political systems in the post-Soviet countries as well as integration efforts in the region since the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, with an emphasis on the post-2000 period. Students have a basic understanding of the issues of determining the type of political regime, relations between centers of power, the issue of ethnic minorities, electoral and party systems in the countries under study, developments in the media, human and civil rights, and the impact of separatist conflicts and terrorism on the development of the countries' political systems and foreign policy. Students can actively read a less demanding scientific text in a foreign language and reproduce its main ideas.
