- a) after obtaining at least such number of credits that after obtaining credits for successful completion of state exams, they achieve the necessary number of credits for the proper completion of studies.
- b) after successful completion of compulsory subjects, compulsory elective subjects, and elective subjects in the composition determined by the study program,
- c) after fulfilling the student's obligations arising from § 71, par. 3 letter b of the Higher Education Act,
- d) if no disciplinary action is taken against them.

Successful completion of the state exam is one of the conditions for successful completion of the study program. The subject of the state exam is evaluated by the committee for state exams using the grading scale A-FX. The evaluation of the state examination or its part is decided by the examination committee by consensus. If the examination committee does not reach a consensus, the evaluation of the state examination or its part is decided by voting.

On the basis of the wording of the study regulations of the faculty (Internal Rules and Regulations 5/2020, Art. 15), the framework dates of state examinations are set by the dean in accordance with the faculty's academic schedule. Departments are obliged to publish the dates of their state exams on the website no later than 5 weeks before they take place. The student registers for the state exam through the academic information system (AIS) at least three weeks before it takes place.

The student is entitled to one regular and two resit attempts of the state exam. The regular attempt is the one for which the student applied for the first time within the deadline set for state exams. If the student was evaluated with the FX mark on the regular attempt of the state exam, the student may take resits of the state exam

Each part is separated from the next one by a break. The commission decides their assessment privately; out of the presence of students and guests. The course of the state examination and the announcement of results are public. The results are announced together; after examining all students registered for the given term.

## State exam syllabus:

Practical usage of MSA within the frame of the covered curricula. Translation from and into Arabic, in which students demonstrate their knowledge of Arabic grammar (morphology and syntax). CA composition on one of the topics determined by the Department and a translation of Arabic journalistic text into Slovak with the help of a print dictionary.

### **Course requirements:**

All matters pertaining to state examination are set out in Article 14 of the Study Regulations of the Faculty of Arts.

In the master's study programmes, the state examination consists only of the defence of the Master's thesis. The student chooses the department as a training centre which corresponds to the discipline within which he/she wants to write the final thesis. He/she reports this choice by the deadline set by the department, provided that he/she is able to find a supervisor and a suitable topic in the relevant department.

For the successful defence of the Master's thesis as the subject of the state examination in the master's degree programmes conducted at the Department of British and American Studies, students will receive credits according to the current study plan (currently 15 credits).

Requirements for the admission to the defence are as follows:

- fulfillment of the requirements of the study plan concerning the prescribed composition of courses and their credit value so that after awarding the credits for the state examination the student obtains the required number of credits for the master's degree;
- submission of the Master's thesis (electronically via the academic information system AIS) by the thesis submission deadline corresponding to the relevant state examination period according to the academic year schedule set by the faculty.

The thesis is evaluated by the standard grading scale (0-59% -FX, 60-67% -E, 68-75% -D, 76-83% -C, 84-91% -B, 92-100% -A) by the supervisor of the thesis and the designated opponent in the assessment reports, which are available to the student no later than 3 working days before the state examination.

The supervisor's report shall also include the percentage of compliance results from the originality check protocols (CRZP, Theses), which must be explicitly evaluated by the supervisor with the wording "the thesis shows/does not show signs of plagiarism".

The Master's thesis will take the following form:

The defence will consist of a thesis presentation (the student chooses the form of the defence, the PPT format can also be used) and the student's response to a broader theoretical question, which is assigned to the student by the supervisor upon the Master's thesis submission. The supervisor will include this question in the assessment report as one of the points of discussion for the defence; it will also be included in the defence report.

The thesis presentation must:

- Include a clearly articulated thesis statement,
- have a clear and logical structure of argumentation and findings,
- reflect a new perspective on the issue as a result of adequate and appropriate work with the findings gained through own research, the conclusions of which the student is able to present and formulate. The criteria for the evaluation (of the defence) of the Master's thesis at the Department of British and American Studies are as follows:

- Quality of the Master's thesis (originality, significance of the analysis, clear formulation of the scientific problem and hypotheses under study, scope of the professional and scientific literature used).
- the adequacy of the methodological approach to the topic under study, the analysis logically and coherently answers the research questions,
- systematic and logical summary of the results of the analysis,
- compliance with citation standards (MLA...),
- language level of the presentation (academic language at least at B2 level),
- quality of the presentation and communication skills.

A concentrated study of selected issues in French literature of earlier periods, with special attention to 19th-century literature, using a literary-historical approach and textual analysis of specific works. The student is well versed in the context of early French literature and the dynamics of change in literary movements and genres. Interactive learning results in a deeper understanding of literary relationships, the ability to take an analytical approach, and literary interpretation based on reading selected works of early French literature.

Course content varies (major topics: 19th century French novel, 19th century French poetry, development of the French novel from its origins to the 19th century, development of French poetry, 17th century French theatre, etc.).

The course has the character of a theoretical interpretation accompanied by an illustration from translation practice, i.e. the realisation of a translation text and its introduction in the publishing sphere, and it counts on the active participation of students who will develop a publishing proposal for the translation of a work of art at the end of the course. The lecture part will concentrate on providing an elementary overview of theories of translation and, on their basis, will address the key problems that an artistic translator may encounter. One of the aims is to orient OPT students and help them to develop their own conception of translation, to develop an acceptable translation method and to acquire the necessary skills in communicating with the publishing environment.

- 6. The subject of translation the translator, competence, concept and method of translation; visibility vs. invisibility of the translator; types of translators; sociological turn in translatology;

# **Learning outcomes:**

After successfully completing the course, the student can work independently with the Aranea language corpora, focusing on French and Slovak, but may extend the corpus work to other languages given that they have acquired basic universal skills with the tool. They may also use the acquired knowledge when working with other electronic language corpora.

Working with the Aranea corpora is aimed at deepening the knowledge and skills in the context of practical proficiency in the French language, so the student sees the corpus as a very good tool in the work of a translator/interpreter (creating glossaries, checking phenomena in context,

comparing translation solutions in the corpus, etc.), as well as in the work of a foreign language teacher, where the language corpus has a variety of uses (creating exercises, illustrative material, reflexive grammar, etc.).

### Class syllabus:

- 1. The French article and its symptomatic use: analysis of the context of the occurrence of article and the production of comparative materials
- 2. Creation of translation exercises
- 3. Adjective position and change of meaning
- 4. Working with the Slovak corpus: comparison/translation
- 5. Gender and change of noun meaning, creation of semantic fields through collocations, preparation of didactic materials
- 6. French past tenses in translation into Slovak
- 7. The question of verbal aspect, observation of adverbs and verbs
- 8. Verb and preposition (creation of glossaries of prepositional constructions with verb and observation of their meanings, use of multilevel frequency distribution, preparation of didactic materials)
- 9. Analysis of the occurrence of neologisms and anglicisms in the Slovak and French corpus
- 10. Substandard vocabulary in French
- 11. Analysis of established phrases in French
- 12. Creation of glossaries of idioms, translation exercises, preparation of didactic materials
