Learning outcomes: The aim of the subject is to expand the knowledge of the PhD. candidates of Evangelical-Lutheran Theology in the field of History of philosophy. After completion of the course the doctoral student acquires not only knowledge of the relevant philosophical notions and terminology, but he/she will understand their usage in the relevant historical period. Acquired knowledge allows him/her to apply the given notions in the further study through comprehensive grasp of subjects that constitute the core of the theological and philosophical discussion of his/her research focus. After the completion of the course,, the PhD. candidate acquires methodological skills allowing him/her to participate in the academic discussions and engage in polemics on some basic philosophical problems. Following the acquired methodological skills and knowledge he/she will be able to grasp and critically evaluate respective arguments in use in the past, and he/she will be able to formulate his/her position in the form of a written thesis. The subject „History of philosophy“ serves especially as an auxiliary discipline for the field of Systematic Theology, Church History, or History of Dogmatic Theology and philosophy of religion. The course is also recommendable for the PhD. candidates who focus on the historical and current hermeneutical problems within the Biblical Sciences and Practical Theology.	
Class syllabus: We will focus conceptually and thematically on the area of philosophical problems that are historically delineated by the epoch of classical Greek philosophy until the relevant philosophical movements of the present. From the perspective of the thematic selection we concentrate especially on deeper understanding and interpretation of the key notions from the history of the Western philosophy from Antiquity till the present. We will focus especially on the topics and notions from the history of metaphysics, hermeneutics, logic, ethics and political philosophy taking into consideration primarily the context of Protestant theology and solution of philosophical problems with which the PhD candidate is confronted in the disciplines of systematic theology, church history, or the history of dogmatic theology, biblical sciences and philosophy of religion. When	

we emphasize primarily the topics from metaphysics, hermeneutics, logic, ethics and political philosophy, we will focus on these four key figures of the history of philosophy: Aristotle, Augustine, Immanuel Kant and Hans Georg Gadamer. After thorough study of the Aristotle's metaphysics, logic and ethics, we will analyze major representative of the patristic philosophy – Augustine. Within the medieval philosophy we will focus on the problem of universals concentrating primarily on concepts of the late scholastics (e.g. William Ockham and Gabriel Biel). The period of the renaissance philosophy will be based on the problems of Reformation in the context of comprehensive philosophical thought of this era. The modern age philosophy will be investigated on the background of the discussion between empiricism and rationalism, followed by the essential definition of the Enlightenment, clarifying especially the stance of Enlightenment towards religion. The History of philosophy in the 19th and 20th century will be presented on the comprehensive characteristics of the work of Immanuel Kant and thought movements, which responded to Kant's philosophical initiative. In the closing part we will focus on the most important philosophical movements of the 20th century: phenomenology, existentialism, structuralism, analytical philosophy and hermeneutics. We will as well introduce the key figures of philosophy of religion or religious philosophy of the 20th century.
