Learning outcomes: By systematic preparation of the dissertation project, the doctoral student, under the guidance of his/her supervisor, not only acquires, but also acquires the ability to apply the basic methods of scientific work and their use in his/her own research and scientific activity. Under the influence of regular logical and thoughtful mentoring of the supervisor, who appropriately influences the whole process of project preparation, the doctoral student is able to formulate basic scientific hypotheses, which are also the presumed result, after completing the course. Throughout the preparation phase, the supervisor's interference is passive. On the contrary, the emphasis on the active component of the research is determined by the doctoral student's own creative activity. The above process is finalised by the elaboration of the dissertation project, in which the doctoral student formulates and refines the basic hypotheses on the basis of the previous scientific investigation of the issue and knowledge, and at the same time establishes a scientific platform for further research in the area under study. The present project has a standard layout and respects the formal and citation criteria as well as the principles of referencing primary and secondary literature. The project aims to clearly, concisely and accurately characterise the subject matter of the PhD student. It also includes elaborated sub-objectives that are conditional to the achievement of the main objective. The project does not lack discussion as well as its results. The author's own positions and solutions arrived at are logically arranged and sufficiently evaluated. At the same time, the doctoral student is able to comment on all the facts and findings in confrontation with the results of other authors or jurisprudents. After	

graduation, the doctoral student is able to present, argue partial outcomes of scientific research and lead a professional discussion on the subject matter.
