The doctoral student deepens his knowledge and expertise in the field of financial law by focusing on specific and current financial-legal issues and problems that are key to the field of public finance, sustainable economic growth, etc. The doctoral student gains an overall overview of the nature and functioning of relations in the field of public finances, regulation of financial markets, budget law, tax harmonization and knows the interactions between them.

Personal status, change of seat of commercial companies, freedom of establishment of commercial companies in the European area. 3. Nominative and innominative contracts, presentation of some institutes of obligation law, analysis of legal practice. 4. Theoretical starting points of financial law and their projection within current financial-legal issues and problems.	

5. Harmonization of taxes within the European Union.
6. Financial and legal regulation within the European Union - monetary policy, budget policy, regulation of financial markets.

Learning outcomes: By systematically preparing a dissertation project under the guidance of his supervisor, the doctoral student not only learns, but also acquires the ability to apply the basic methods of scientific work and their use in his own research and scientific activity. Under the influence of the supervisor's regular logical and well-thought-out mentoring, which appropriately influences the entire process of project preparation, after completing the subject, the doctoral student is able to formulate basic scientific hypotheses, which are also a presumed result. In the entire preparation phase, the trainer's intervention is passive. On the contrary, the emphasis placed on the active component of research is determined by the doctoral student's own creative activity. The aforementioned process is finalized by the development of a dissertation project, in which the doctoral student formulates and refines basic hypotheses based on the scientific research of the issue and knowledge to date, and at the same time creates a scientific platform for further research in the researched area. The presented project has a standard format and respects the formal and citation criteria as well as the principles of referring to primary and secondary literature. The goal of the doctoral project is to clearly, succinctly and accurately characterize the subject of the solution. It also includes elaborated sub-goals that condition the achievement of the main goal. The project does not lack discussion, as well as its results. The author's own attitudes and solutions arrived at are logically organized and sufficiently evaluated. At the same time, the doctoral student can comment on all the facts and knowledge in confrontation with the results of other authors or case law. After graduation, the doctoral student	

is able to present, argue partial results of scientific research and lead a professional discussion regarding the issue in question.
