Learning outcomes: In this course, postgraduate students have the opportunity to experience the context of a research team, practice communication and presentation skills, as well as emotional intelligence skills within a team, alongside other doctoral students. The course is conducted through experiential team learning while working on their own research projects, simulating the work of a research team. The aim of the course is to provide doctoral students with the experience of functioning as a member of a research team, using feedback on their research dissertation project from other participants and the course leader. Students improve their individual team skills, communication, and presentation skills through model situations.
